- Fiction books related to the topics such as We're going on a Bear Hunt, Teddy Bear's Picnic, Dinosaur Stomp.
- Writing in a variety of contexts Lists, labels, letters, stories, recounts.
- Reading a variety of texts and identifying tricky words.
