Attendance

You can view your child/children's school attendance via the MCAS (My Child at School) App.

Regular school attendance is essential in order that children can maximise all learning opportunities. Poor attendance is directly linked to lower academic attainment. It also means that children can miss out on the social side of school life, which can affect their ability to make and keep friendships. Here at Belmont, we want our children to develop good patterns of attendance and punctuality and grow up learning that every moment in school counts.

100%-99% (0-2 days off)

96% - 98% (4-7.5 days off)

95%-92% (9.5-17 days off)

Under 90% (19+ days off)

We will soon find out which class have had the highest attendance for the Autumn term. The winning class will celebrate their achievement with a special treat on Friday 19th December.

Term time leave:

A polite reminder to families that in line with Government guidance, there is no entitlement to holiday during term time.

We understand that travel and family holidays can often be more affordable during term time, however regular school attendance is essential for your child/children's learning. Even a few days away from school can disrupt their routine and affect their understanding of current topics.

The lead up to Christmas is always an exciting time in school. Children take part in nativities, concerts, pantomime experiences and of course Father Christmas visits! We do hope your child/ren will be here to enjoy this special time. Please note that sickness absence immediately before and/or after the school holiday will not be automatically authorised and school may request medical evidence to support and authorise periods of sickness absence.

Reporting sickness absence:

If your child is sick and unable to attend school/nursery, please complete the online absence form by 9am. This is especially important for children in Y6 who travel to school on their own. A form should be completed for each day of absence.


We're here to help:

Family Hubs are welcoming spaces where babies, children, young people, parents and carers can get support, advice and access to services, all in one place.


They're here for families with children aged 0–19 (or up to 25 if your child has SEND), offering help with things like:


- Parenting support
