We can't wait to welcome you back for more festive magic!




Jack & the Beanstalk - Lyric Theatre



Attendance

Term time leave:

A polite reminder to families that in line with Government guidance, there is no entitlement to holiday during term time.

We understand that travel and family holidays can often be more affordable during term time, however regular school attendance is essential for your child/children's learning. Even a few days away from school can disrupt their routine and affect their understanding of current topics.

The lead up to Christmas is always an exciting time in school. Children take part in nativities, concerts, pantomime experiences and of course Father Christmas visits! We do hope your child/ren will be here to enjoy this special time.

Please note that sickness absence immediately before and/or after the school holiday will not be automatically authorised and school may request medical evidence to support and authorise periods of sickness absence.



Sickness:

We all get sick from time to time and as we approach the colder months, we are all susceptible to seasonal colds, coughs and viruses. Most mild illness, such as a runny nose, sore throat or slight cough, do not require time off school, unless a child has a temperature.

'Catch It, Bin It, Kill It:

Simple everyday habits can help stop infection from spreading:

Catch it: Use a tissue to cover your nose and mouth when you cough or sneeze or cough/sneeze into your elbow – not your hands.

Bin it: Throw used tissues straight into a bin.

Kill it: Wash hands and try not to touch your eyes, nose or mouth with unwashed hands.
